
and Hadrian has it... oops). They are worth waiting for.





I could find allot of recopies that required Brandy or Vodka but I did not want to use them I wanted to make it with out the added alcohol. Now don't get me wrong I did want my brew to be alcoholic, however I am not big on Brandy or Vodka and I really did want to try something different so I found a basic cordial recipe and added my own twist to it.






